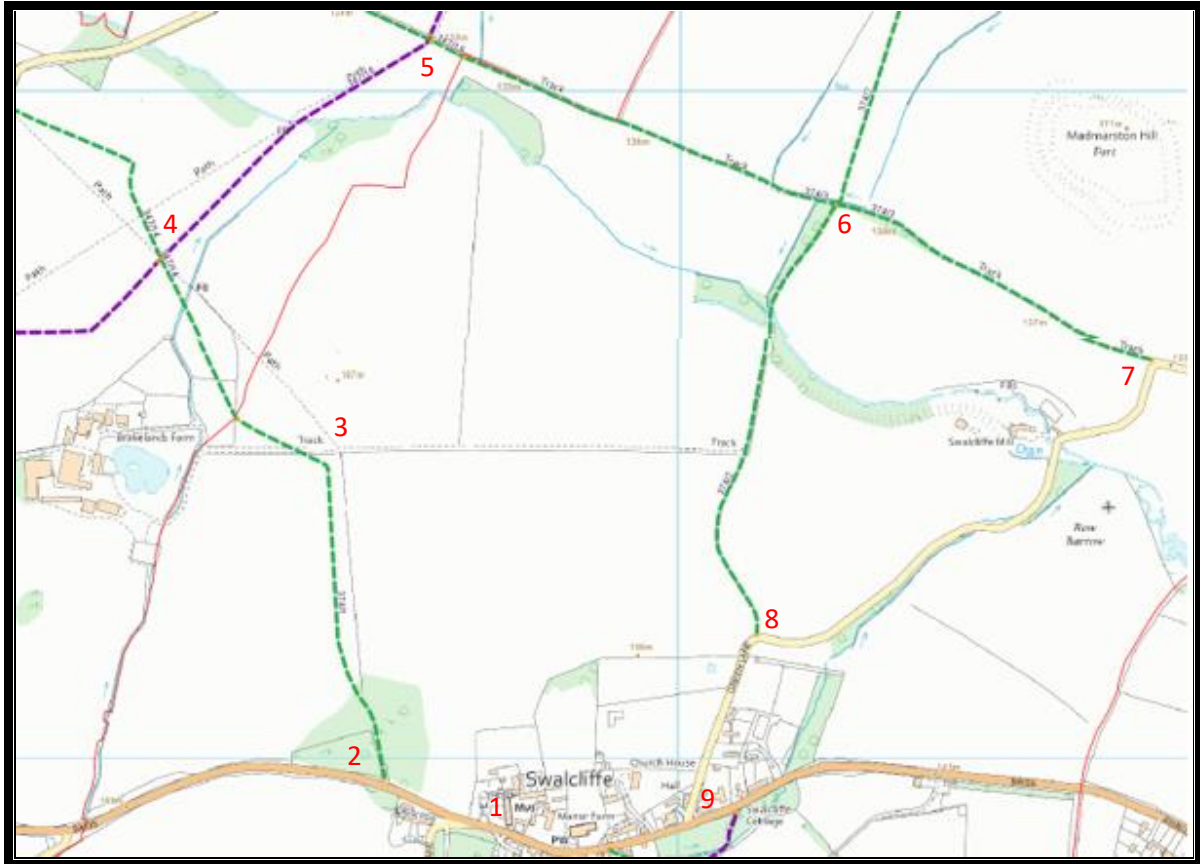


Walks round Swalcliffe #3 – Roman Road

A 4.5km (2.8m) or 3.2km (2.0m) round walk to the north of the village on tracks, across fields and on roads. It may be wet underfoot in places.

Start and finish at the Tithe Barn **1**, where there is limited free parking.



From the car park, turn right onto the main road and walk out of the village. At the Swalcliffe village boundary sign **2** turn right through the gate onto the bridleway. Follow the path through the wood, which may be muddy, down the edge of the field and across the track **3**, then diagonally left across the next field.

Cross the footbridge and continue 150m into the next field where the bridleway crosses a footpath **4**. Turn right along the footpath towards the left-hand edge of a clump of coniferous trees and cross the footbridge, then across the next field to the track (Roman road) **5**.

Turn right onto the track and continue along it through a gate **6**. Here you can turn right for a shorter route (described below) or continue along the track until it meets the single lane metalled road **7**. Turn right and follow the road to where it turns left uphill **8**.

[For the shorter route, turn right along the track at **6**, and cross the stream. Where the track bends right continue straight ahead along the footpath to the village (it may be muddy in places) to the metalled road **8**.]

Continue uphill along the road to the main road **9** and turn right back to the Tithe Barn.
